Planned Date: Winter/Spring 2011-2013

Location: The project is located on the Thousand Lake Mountain. The project area lies east of the towns of Fremont, Lyman, and Horse Valley.

Legal Description: Township 27 South, Range 3 East, Sections 12, 13, 24, 25, 35, 36; Township 28 South, Range 3 East, Sections 1, 2, 11, 12

Lat/Long: N 38 x 24' x 18.2"; W 111 x 31' x 59.3"

Project Description: This is a 3569 acre wildlife project. This year the Fremont River Ranger District hopes to complete another 400 acres of the 3569 total acres in 2011.

The vegetation treatments will reduce the number of pinyon/juniper trees that has increased over the past several years causing a downward trend on wildlife winter range. Tractors with brush saws and/or masticator attachments, chainsaws and prescribed fire will be used to remove the trees. The primary areas of focus for this treatment would be in meadows and slopes where small diameter trees are beginning to occupy these sites that did not appear to be there historically.
