Fire Restrictions to be Implemented in Zion National Park; Campfires Prohibited

Restrictions also to be Implemented in Southwest Utah and the Arizona Strip

As a result of the high fire danger in Zion National Park restrictions are being instituted prohibiting campfires and smoking on trails. These restrictions will be in effect starting at **12:01 a.m. on Monday, June 25, 2007** and will be enforced until rescinded by the Superintendent. Park officials feel that the risk to public safety and structures within Zion National Park from a human-caused fire is great enough that these restrictions are necessary. Similar restrictions will also be implemented in Washington County, Utah, Iron and Beaver Counties in Utah (west of I-15) and the Arizona Strip.

The following acts will be **prohibited** in Zion National Park until further notice starting **Monday, June 25, 2007 at 12:01 a.m.**

- **Setting, building, maintaining, attending, or using a campfire in campgrounds, picnic areas, or permanently improved places of habitation.***
*Stoves fueled by petroleum, liquid Propane Gas (LPG), or charcoal fires are allowed.
- **Smoking on all trails.***
*Smoking is allowed within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or designated smoking area.
- **Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks or other pyrotechnic devices, is prohibited at all times on all federal public lands.**

Violation of the above, prohibited acts is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 and/or imprisonment for not more than twelve months, or both.
