Location: The project is located in Sevier
County, two and one half miles south of the
Gooseberry administrative site and campground.

Legal Description: The project area is
in Township 23 South, Range 2 East
Sections 33 & 34; Township 24 South,
Range 2 East, Sections 3, 10, 11, and
15.

Project Description:

The Seven Mile Timber Piles Burn Plan covers the piles of machine and hand piled slash that has resulted from the Seven Mile, Niotche and other small timber sales. This project is located in Sevier County. Previous treatment on this project includes approximately 200 acres of timber harvest and associated piling. The project consists of the burning of scattered machine and hand piles throughout approximately 200 acres of timber harvest areas located entirely on National Forest System lands. The primary fuels treatment objective of this pile burn is to reduce the existing wildland fire hazard resulting from activity fuels, thus reducing potential negative effects from future wildland fire to both Forest Service and nearby private lands.
