The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is looking for employees to work on a variety of wildland firefighting positions this summer. 2. Type the Position name in the "Keywords" box and "Utah" in the "Location" box.
3. Apply by the "Early Consideration Date" if you are interested in a specific location.

KEY REQUIREMENTS

- You must be a U.S. Citizen.
- Positions may require a valid state driver's license.
- Some positions may require a CDL.
- All positions have medical qualification, including drug testing, requirements.
- You must be 18 years of age or older prior to appointment.
- You must be able to pass the work capacity fitness test (Must carry a 45 lb. pack for 3 miles within 45 minutes).
