John Kidd's Type 2 Incident Management Team is returning command of the Middle Ridge, Greek Peak, and Cottonwood Fires to the local land management agencies tomorrow morning. All fire resources and support personnel will be released with the exception of those listed below. One local Incident Commander will assume responsibility for both the Middle Ridge and Cottonwood Fires, which are located in Nevada, and another will command the Greek Peak Fire, located in Utah. The fires will be monitored until fully contained, likely before the end of the weekend.

Less precipitation occurred in the vicinity today than over the previous three days. Fire crews were able to complete all rehabilitation from suppression activities, including the cleaning of areas that were used for remote camps and equipment staging areas.

Flash floods in the recently burned area will continue to be a potential hazard when rain storms are present. All visitors to the areas should use caution. Drier air is predicted to move into the area later in the week, and the chance of thunderstorms will decrease by Friday, with temperatures returning to normal averages.

➤ **Middle Ridge Fire**      **10,304 acres, 89% contained**

➤ **Cottonwood Fire**      **1,127 acres, 90% contained**

One helicopter will be reassigned from the MGC Complex to both the Middle Ridge and Cottonwood Fires. Additional local resources will be patrolling the two fires and taking action as necessary on any flare ups or hot spots.

➤ **Greek Peak Fire**      **761 acres, 95% contained**

A flight of the Greek Peak Fire was conducted today with infrared technology and only minimal heat was detected. The fire will now be managed by Cedar City, Utah, resources, including one helicopter that has been reassigned from the Complex.

**This will be the final update for the three fires unless significant activity occurs.**
