Summary: The Toquerville Fire is now 100 percent contained. Crews are working to suppress isolated hotspots and will continue mop-up operations. Fire behavior today was minimal and the fire remains at 248 acres. This will be the last update for this incident unless the fire grows due to unforeseen circumstances.

Start Date: Monday, May 01, 2012 at 11:00 a.m.

Location: Northeast of Toquerville, Utah off of Highway 17.

Jurisdiction: City of Toquerville and Bureau of Land Management Land.

Fire Size: 248 acres (Note: one acre is equivalent to one football field). Significant change in acreage is due to precise GPS mapping versus previous estimation of size.

Cause: Human caused, debris burning was the specific cause.

Fire Behavior: Fire behavior is minimal, isolated hotspots remain.

Structures: No structures are currently threatened.

Percent Contained: 100%

Fuels: Cheatgrass, mixed brush, and scattered pinyon and juniper trees.

Fire Crews/Resources: Approximately 31 interagency fire personnel are assigned to the fire including fire engines, one hand crew, and miscellaneous overhead.

Injuries: Two firefighters were injured Tuesday, May 1 (heat related illness). Injuries are not life threatening.
