## Fire Restriction Order

Due to current and forecasted weather conditions coupled with the extremely dry condition and heavy loading of vegetation throughout the State of Utah, the State Forester has determined that measures must be taken to prevent costly and damaging forest and rangeland fires. Therefore, pursuant to Utah State Law, Section 65A-8-212 Utah Code 1994. The following acts are prohibited on the areas, roads and trails described below until rescinded by the Utah State Forester:

1. Discharge of firearms for target shooting.

The following persons are exempted from the above prohibitions:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act at a specific location.
2. Any sworn law enforcement entity conducting a department sponsored training operation at a designated range.
3. Any person legally participating in a lawful pursuit of a game animal.

#### Area Description:

All unincorporated private and state lands within the following areas:

**In Utah County:** The Lake Mountain area including, lands South of SR 73, West of SR 68 and North of US 6 to the Utah County line.

The West Mountain area including, lands West of SR 141 and bordered both South and East of Utah Lake.

**In Davis County:** From the northeast border where Davis County, Weber County and the National Forest meet at Interstate 84 in Weber Canyon westward along the Davis/Weber county line to the South Weber city limits. South along the eastern borders of South Weber, Layton, Kaysville, Fruit Heights, Farmington, Centerville, Bountiful, and North Salt Lake to the Salt Lake County Border. East along the Davis Salt Lake County Border to where unincorporated Davis County meets with the National Forest Boundary. North along the unincorporated Davis County-National Forest Boundary to I-84. Exemptions: The Lions Range above Bountiful, the Wahsatch Shooters Association Public Shooting Range, and the Centerville Small Arms Range.

**Cache County:** In Millville Canyon beginning at the south fence line of the water treatment facility intersecting the deer fence traveling south along the deer fence to the hay barn east from the hay barn to the National Forest boundary north along that boundary to a point directly west of the water treatment facility traveling easterly back to the deer fence.

The area of the Richmond Gun Range owned/managed by DNR/DWR. from the locked

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gate to include all of the range area to the USFS boundary north along that boundry 1000 yards west down the canyon to the fence, south along the fence to the locked gate.

**Summit County:** The area within the Weber Canyon drainage from its mouth at Elkhorn Lane to the top of the canyon at Gardner's Fork.

In Echo Canyon within on-half mile on either side of I-80 from I-84 to Emery.


Within all residential subdivisions on the North Slope of the Uinta Mountains including but not limited to Manorlands and Uintalands.

This order does not affect incorporated towns and cities or indoor shooting ranges. The order will be regularly evaluated and when conditions permit, rescinded.
