# Course Descriptions

## **S 130/190 - Basic Firefighter Training & Wildland Fire Behavior**

**\$300.00**

An introductory course designed to train entry level firefighters, and refresh structural and wildland firefighters. You will gain knowledge of the basic incident management organization, firefighting techniques, suppression equipment, safety, strategy/tactics, and fire behavior.

Weather permitting, field exercises will be held for valuable hands-on training.

**Special Instructions:** Students must bring all PPE and camping gear for two nights in the field.

## **S 131 - Advanced Firefighter Training**

**\$217.00**

This course was designed to meet the training needs of both advanced firefighter/squad boss (FFT1) and incident command type 5 (ICT5). The course is interactive, and contains several exercises encouraging group and class discussion. It provides a comprehensive review of the Fireline Handbook. Training also includes strategy, tactics, and safety with group exercises. *Prerequisites: Qualified as a Firefighter Type 2, S 130/190.*

**Special Instructions:** This course has 8 hours of classroom instruction with two days of field exercise. Students must bring all PPE and camping gear for two nights in the field.

## **S-203 - Introduction to Incident Information**

**\$260.00**

The purpose of this course is to provide students with the skill and knowledge needed to serve as public information officers. The course covers establishing and maintaining an incident information operation, communicating with internal and external audiences, working with the news media, handling special situations and long term planning and strategy

## **S 215 - Fire Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface**

**\$250.00**

This course is designed to assist structure and wildland firefighters who will be making tactical decisions when confronting wildland fire that threatens life, property, and improvements, in the wildland/urban interface.

*Prerequisites: Wildland Agencies: Students should be single resource boss qualified (tractor/plow, dozer, engine, or crew). Structure Fire Departments: Students should have completed S-130, S-190, S-230, S-231, I-100 and I-200 or equivalent training.*

## **S 230 - Crew Boss (Single Resource)**

**for both 230/231**

**\$200.00**

This course is designed to meet the needs of a crew boss on an incident. Units include preparation, mobilization, tactics, safety, off-line duties, demobilization, and post incident responsibilities.

*Prerequisites: Qualified as Advanced Firefighter/Squad Boss, S 131 and S 290.*

**Special Instructions:** This course is combined with the S-231 Engine Boss course.

## **S 231 - Engine Boss (Single Resource)**

**for both 230/231**

**\$200.00**

A skill course to produce proficiency in the performance of all duties associated with single resource boss. You will identify crew and engine capabilities; gather information for assignments, and communicate and coordinate effectively with crew members.

*Prerequisites: Qualified as Advanced Firefighter/Squad Boss, S 131, S 230 and S 290*

**Special Instructions:** This course is combined with the S-230 Crew Boss course.

## **S 260 - Incident Business Management**

**\$90.00**

Discusses business management principals associated with incidents. Course includes:

Employee responsibilities and conduct, recruitment, personnel time recording, pay and commissary, correct reporting procedures for injuries, procurement and equipment time recording, property documentation, cooperative agreements with other agencies and claims/accident investigations.

## **S 261 - Applied Interagency Incident Business Management**

**\$40.00**

This course is designed for entry level finance positions. Students work directly from the Interagency Incident Business Handbook. The format is a mixture of exercises, facilitated group discussion and lecture.

## **S 270 - Basic Air Operations**

**\$90.00**

This course covers aircraft types and capabilities, aviation management and safety for flying in and working with agency aircraft, tactical and logistical uses of aircraft, and requirements for helicopter takeoff and landing areas.

**S 271 - Helicopter Crew Member****\$175.00**

This is a combined classroom and field exercise course. Topics will include: aviation safety, aircraft capabilities and limitations, aviation life support equipment, pre-flight check-list, crash survival, helicopter operations and helicopter field exercise.

*Prerequisites: Qualified as fire fighter type 2*

**S 290 - Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior****\$200.00**

This skills course is designed to instruct prospective fire line supervisors in wildland fire behavior for effective and safe fire management operations.

*Prerequisites: S 130/190.*

**L 280 - Fellowship to Leadership****\$80.00**

This course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. Topics include: leadership values, team cohesion factors, and ethical decision making. Special Instructions: Student will be required to bring PPE to this course for the field exercises.

*Prerequisites: L 180, experience on incident assignments in operations or support functions.*

**FI 210 - Wildland Fire Origin and Cause Determination****\$200.00**

The purpose of this course is to provide a consistent knowledge and skill base for the Wildland Fire Origin and Cause Determination Investigator. The concepts taught in this course will help an INVF perform at an acceptable level on a national basis without regard to geographic boundaries.

*Target group will include experienced fire personnel and law enforcement officers with wildland fire investigation responsibilities*

*Prerequisites: Students should have law enforcement or firefighter experience. There is an interactive self-paced pre-course work to familiarize students with the background information necessary to successfully complete the course*

**I 200 - ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents****\$80.00**

This course introduces the students to the Incident Command System associated with incident-related performance. Topics will include leadership and management, delegation of authority and management by objectives

**BL300/RT301 - Fire Equipment Driver Training****\$80.00**

This training consists of two courses. Each course is 4-5 hours long. They include both classroom and actual on-road and off road driving. The BL300 is the orientation driver training (May 16) and the RT301 is the refresher training (May 17).

These are required courses for all regular drivers of specialty equipment. Specialty equipment includes fire engines, water tenders, helicopter support vehicles, and crew carriers.
